## **ANNOUNCEMENT**





#### 1. GENERAL REGULATIONS

**The Nordics** will be conducted in accordance with the ISU Constitution and General Regulations 2022, the ISU Special Regulations & Technical Rules for Single & Pair Skating2022, and all relevant ISU Communications.

Participation in the **Nordics Open** is open to all Competitors who belong to an ISU Member and qualify with regard to eligibility according to Rule 102, provided their ages fall within the limits specified in Rule 108, paragraph 3 a) and they meet the participation, citizenship and residency requirements in Rule 109, paragraphs 1 through 5 and ISU Communication 2030 or any update of this Communication.

Passports/EU ID cards of all Skaters, as well as the ISU Clearance Certificate, if applicable, must be presented at the accreditation of the event for verification.

All competitors must be entered through their respective Member Federation.

The Nordics 2024 is organized by Borås Konståkningsklubb and the Swedish Figure Skating Association

Each invited Member from all other ISU Members has the right to enter competitors as follows;

- √ 2 Senior Men and 2 Senior Women
- ✓ 2 Junior Men and 2 Junior Women

Citizen / Residence requirements and Clearance Procedure: In accordance with Rule 109 of ISU Regulations and ISU Communication 2030 or any update of it, all skaters who do not have the

Nationality of the Member, which they have been entered or who although having such nationality, have in the past representing another Member, must produce an ISU Clearance Certificate.

#### **Entries of officials**

The host Nordic country member is responsible for appointing Referees and Technical panels for all categories, following initial suggestions from the Nordic country members as well as for the appointment of the Judges panels.

Each Nordic country member is responsible for providing at least one (1) international or ISU level judge, and at least one (1) technical panel member, but maximum two (2) Technical Controllers or Specialists. The Host country completes the panels of Officials according to the ISU Rules and relevant Communications regarding world standing points and officials' activity.

#### **Entry fee**

The entry fee is **75** € per skater and a minimum of **250** € per Nordic Member. In addition each Nordic country pays a contribution of **500** €.

The entry fee will not be refunded in case of withdrawals for any reason. Entry fee must be paid by **January 28 2024** through invoice to be sent out after the final entry day.

#### 4. MUSIC & PLANNED PEOGRAM CONTENT

Music files in mp3 format are requested to be uploaded on web links not later than January 8. See page 7.

Each competitor must have an own back up-up drive (USB stick)with music files in the format of MP3. Each file must be clearly marked with: Name, category, country and type of program (SP/FS)

Each ISU Member is also asked to upload the national anthem on web link according to information on page 8.

Please note: CD:s will not be accepted

The Planned Program Content must also be entered by the ISU Member or the skater in the ISU portal.

#### **Chaperon Accomodation**

It is not possible for Chaperon's to book accommodation at the official hotel.

The Organizing Committee can recommend chaperons to make their bookning at <u>Comfort Jazz Hotel</u> in the central Borås. The hotel is situated on short walking distance from the official hotel.

#### Meals

Teams can book meals, lunch and dinner, starting on Wednesday lunch and ending with Sunday lunch except Friday dinner. Meals can be booked at the arena or at Quality Grand Hotel.

#### Arena - meal box:

Cost per meal and person is 120 SEK.

Lunch box can be picked up between 11:00-14:00 Dinner box can be picked up between 18:00-21:00

#### Quality Grand Hotel - buffé:

Lunch buffet 165 SEK/person - 11:30-14:00

Dinner buffet 195 SEK per person – 19:00-22:00

All meals must be pre booked. Meal tickets will be given out per country at the accreditation on site. The meals will be paid by invoice to be sent out after the final entry day.

#### The Official Dinner

The Official Dinner for the Officials, coaches, team leaders and skaters will be held on Friday evening 19:30 at Orangeriet in Stadsparken (2 min walk from Quality Hotel Grand Borås). The dinner cost is 450 SEK/ person.

All banquet tickets must be pre booked by each Member The dinner will be paid by invoice to be sent out after the final entry day.

Meal tickets will be distributed to the Team Leaders at the time of registration according to bookings.

#### 6. TRANSPORTATION

The closest international airport is Gothenburg Landvetter international airport. From Landvetter there is approximately 30 minutes by bus to/from Borås. The Organizer will not provide pick up service at the airport, since the public airport buses run frequently to/from Borås.

The railway station and the stop for airport buses are on walking distance to the official hotels.

On Sunday after the Victory Ceremony and the RTD the Organizing Committee is planning to provide transportation by bus from the arena direct to Gothenburg Landvetter airport for 350 SEK per person if at least 30 persons are interested. #### 7. PRACTICE

Official practice begins Thursday February 1 for all categories.

Unofficial practice will take place on Wednesday January 31 in the practice rink. Unofficial practice (200 SEK per 50 minutes) must be booked via link.

#### 8. EXPENSES

Each participating Member must bear all expenses for their Competitors, Judges, Technical Panel (TC/TS/DO/RO), Team Leaders and Coaches. The meals (lunch and dinner) and pocket money for the Technical Panel members are borne by the Organizer.

If a Nordic country does not provide a judge and a technical panel person from their own country, the Country must cover the costs of one judge/technical panel person invited by the organizer. Travel and accommodation expenses will be paid only for the invited Referees, invited Technical Panel Members and invited Judges from outside Nordic countries.

#### 9. **REGISTRATION**

Accreditation will be given to all Referees, Judges, Technical Panels, Competitors, Team Leaders, Coaches and Representatives from each Member Federation. Accreditation will be given at the Rink upon arrival.

#### 10. STARTING ORDER

The draw for the starting order for short program Junior Women will be held on January 31 at 19:00 at the Quality Grand Hotel. Starting order for the remaining categories will take place the day before the respective short program, exact time and place will be published in the official detailed schedule.

Starting order for the free skating will be in the reverse order of the result of the short program.

#### 11. RESULTS

Judging and calculations will be done according to ISU Special Regulations Single & Pair Skating and Ice Dance 2022, Rules 352 and 353.

#### 12. AWARDS

The three best-placed Competitors in each event will be announced and honored at the official Victory Ceremony. Gold, silver and bronze medals will be presented to the medalists. The national anthem of the winner will be played.

#### 13. LIABILITY

In accordance with ISU Rule 119, it is the sole obligation of each member participation in The Nordics 2018, to provide medical and accident insurance for their athletes, officials and all other members of the Member's team. Such insurance must assure full medical attendance and also the return of the ill or injured person to the home country by air transport or by other expeditious means. The Organizer assumes no responsibility for or liability with respect to bodily or personal injury or property damage incurred by competitors and officials.

All referees, Technical Controllers, Technical Specialists, Data and Replay Operators and Judges are responsible for making their travel arrangements in order to be able to attend the respective event related meetings.



## 17. BORÅS AND THE VENUE AREA



Borås Ice Rink is located in the Knalleland event and shopping area north of Borås Centre.

Here you will find lots of shops, restaurants and other types of sports facilities within walking distance. Borås Zoo is also closely connected to the area (10 min walk from the ice rink).

There are several free parking lots in the area and near the rink you will find both a gas station and charging boxes for those who come by car.

The arena itself has all the functions that the Nordics needs and contains two separate ice surfaces: the main rink which is our official practice & competition arena, and the practice rink, which is only used for practice during the Nordics.

All areas intended only for accredited participants are located in the basement with a participant entrance and our entrance level, which you reach via the main entrance, contains common areas, cafeteria, competition office and public areas including bleachers etc.
